76 How to Ask Questions in French



CLOSE-ENDED QUESTIONS

 Questions that require a yes or no answer.

Ex: Est-ce que le chat est dehors ? (Is the cat outside?)

OPEN-ENDED QUESTIONS

• Questions that require specific information.

Ex: Où est le chat ? (Where is the cat?)

PART II: HOW TO ASK OPEN-ENDED QUESTIONS

1) By using intonation

Raise your pitch at the end of the sentence + add an interrogative word, usually at the end of the question.

SUBJECT + VERB + INTERROGATIVE WORD + ?

Ex: Tu vas où ? (Where are you going?)



A With the interrogative word "pourquoi" (why) add "pourquoi" at the beginning of the question.

Ex: "Pourquoi tu pleures? (Why are you crying?)

2) By using "est-ce que"

Add "est-ce que" at the beginning of the sentence + add an interrogative word at the beginning of the question (before "est-ce que.")

INTERROGATIVE WORD + EST-CE QUE + SUBJECT + VERB + ?

Ex: Où est-ce que tu vas ? (Where are you going?)

⚠ With the interrogative word "quoi" (what), change "quoi" to "qu'"

Ex: Qu'est-ce que tu manges ? (What are you eating?)

3) By using simple inversion

Switch the order between the subject pronoun and the verb + add a hyphen between the subject pronoun and the verb + add an interrogative word at the beginning of the question.

INTERROGATIVE WORD + VERB + HYPHEN + SUBJECT PRONOUN + ?

Ex: Où vas-tu ? (Where are you going?)

⚠ With the interrogative word "quoi" (what), change "quoi" to "que."

Ex: Que manges-tu? (What are you eating?)
