"Savoir" Vs. "Connaître": Which One to Choose?

90 "Savoir" Vs. "Connaître"...

SAVOIR (TO KNOW)

 as in knowing "how to" (a skill) or knowing a piece of information

CONNAÎTRE (TO KNOW)

 as in being familiar with someone, something, or somewhere

EXAMPLES

- Il sait nager. (He knows how to swim.)
- Elle sait parler français. (She knows how to speak French.)
- Est-ce que vous savez où est la pharmacie ? (Do you know where the pharmacy is?)
- Je ne sais pas où elle est. (I don't know where she is.)

- Je connais sa sœur. (I know his sister.)
- Est-ce que tu connais Paris ? (Do you know Paris?)
- Je connais cette chanson ! (I know this song!)



GRAMMAR TIP

- "savoir" is often followed by verbs
- "connaître" is often followed by nouns
 - Je ne connais pas ce pays. (I don't know this country.)
 - Je connais très bien son <u>cousin</u>. (I know his cousin very well.)
 - Je ne sais pas <u>conduire</u>. (I don't know how to drive.)
 - Je sais qu'il <u>est</u> en retard. (I know that he is late.)
