“Jour” Vs. “Journée”: Which One to Choose?

95 “Jour” Vs. “Journée”...



LE JOUR (DAY)

- used to express a time unit (whole 24-hour day.)

LA JOURNÉE (DAY)

- used to express a length of time (usually the length of time between sunrise and sunset.)

EXAMPLES

- *Il y a 7 jours dans une semaine.*
(There are seven days in a week.)
- *Quel jour sommes-nous ? / Quel jour on est ?* (What day is today?)
- *Je pars en vacances dans 3 jours.*
(I'm going on vacation in 3 days.)

- *J'ai travaillé toute la journée.* (I worked all day.)
- *Est-ce que tu as passé une bonne journée ?* (Did you have a good day?)
- *Il a plu toute la journée.* (It rained all day.)

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
