CHEAT SHEET

How to Use Partitive Articles in French

RULES:

#1 Before a masculine noun, use the partitive article: <u>du</u>

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Il mange <u>du</u> pain. (He's eating [some] bread.)
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#2 Before a feminine noun, use the partitive article: de la

Tu veux de la salade? (Do you want [some] salad?)

#3 Before a noun starting with a vowel or a mute h (whether it's feminine or masculine) use the partitive article: de l'

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Je bois <u>de l'</u>eau. (I'm drinking [some] water.)
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#4 Before a plural noun (whether it's feminine or masculine) use the partitive article: <u>des</u>

On achète des pâtes. (We're buying [some] pasta.)



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
